



As St. Paul writes in Philippians 1:6, 9-11 "being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus... National Day of Intercession at Chennai - Saturday, October 2nd, 2010 – A Report

The need to revive Intercession as a ministry was felt very strongly by the Madras Service Team and so the National Day of Intercession on Saturday, October 2 provided the right platform to revive this ministry on a full scale.

We began by reconstituting the core team of the Madras Intercessory Network (MIN) in the month of September. With the new MIN core team in place, new avenues for Intercession were explored.

A decade of the rosary and Holy Eucharist at different parishes was offered by all Service team members as part of our efforts. A Night Vigil at St. Teresa's Church with a focus on Intercession was also organized. In addition, the prayer groups in Chennai had regular intercession for the intercessions as part of their prayer meetings. Some prayer groups dedicated one particular weekly prayer meeting with Intercession as the central theme with adoration before the Blessed Sacrament and teachings on Intercession.

The National Day of Intercession, itself, in a sense was a celebration of prayer at Chennai on October 2nd, 2010. Instead of merely organizing Intercession, we decided to have a rally to mobilise, motivate and train intercessors as well as have a day of prayer.



Romeo Fernando from Mumbai led those gathered from different prayer groups in the city in a workshop style of instruction on intercession. In the very first session all the participants could experience the anointing of the Spirit as Romeo gave an altar call for those who wished to answer a commitment to the ministry of intercession. Almost the entire hall of people responded to the call and came forward to be prayed over.



The people were led in a workshop style of intercession covering various attitudes and dispositions of intercessors. After each aspect, the group was led in intercession which reflected each attitude and disposition shared. The intentions of the NIN were broken down and prayed for at appropriate places.



In the afternoon session Romeo spoke about methods of intercession, a need to have a place for prayer both personal and community, praying in the Spirit and the need to give from our worship life to God. He then spoke about the need to discern the needs of Chennai and the renewal in Chennai.

Even as those who received a word from the Lord came forward and shared. prophecies were discerned. pray The need to for forgiveness between youth and elders was discerned and shared with the entire gathering.

In a spirit of unity, both youth representatives from the YU4C and youth groups present and elders in the renewal both asked each other for forgiveness and prayed for healing to take place in any broken relationship between elders and youth.



The Madras Intercessory Network (MIN) announced three venues for centralized intercession on the day. The day concluded with Holy Eucharist and a commitment call where 30 people gave a commitment to intercede daily and to be a part of centralized intercession.

Praise the Lord for helping raise prayer warriors for the city of Chennai!

And then there's the shopping, the dresses, and the cakes to bake. You should take care not to forget your friends and ensure the Christmas lunch turns out right.


And oh, let's not forget Jesus is the Reason for this Season!



The Madras Service Team:

The Madras Service Team is a body of servant leaders serving the Catholic Charismatic Renewal in Chennai representing various prayer groups.

CORE GROUP TRAINING SEMINAR – Animated by Colin Calmiano

The Madras Service Team organised a 2-day workshop style formation program for core groups of various prayer groups in the city and also potential leaders in October. The program was held in two batches in two different venues on different dates to make it convenient for members from different parts of the city to attend. The program was organised in the North Zone on October 9 and 10 and in the South Zone on October 30 and 31. A total of 44 leaders attended the program in both zones and benefited with insights.

Marie Surrao, Springs of Life Prayer Group, Choolai speaking about the experiences that the core group members from her prayer group had about the seminar said, "The training seminar gave us pointers that opened our eyes to our own drawbacks. It has pushed us to do better and improve ourselves as servant leaders. As a prayer group, it has helped us evaluate ourselves during the workshops and identify where we needed to improve. The session on commitment and re-ordering lives reminded us of the seriousness of our calling as leaders and what we need to do to live up to that commitment."

The sessions began with an introductory talk by Dr. Dominic, Little Mount Prayer Group leader on the origins of the Catholic Charismatic Renewal. He went on to speak about the five fold function of the Charismatic Renewal in the context of prayer groups and their importance to the functioning and spread of the renewal.

Colin then animated the sessions alternated by practical workshops and open discussions where the respective core groups of different prayer groups met to evaluate and ideate based on the talks they had heard.

Colin began by highlighting the qualities of a prayer group leader and what a prayer group is meant to do and presented guidelines on its functioning. He also spoke about 22 qualities of a leader and the need to constantly evaluate so that those called to leadership grow in their calling.

He devoted and entire session on "Re-ordering Our Lives" where he illustrated the importance of leaders prioritising and balancing their lives to avoid the danger of burning out or neglecting their relationship with God which was the most important aspect of their lives. In the second batch of the seminar, Colin also dealt with the importance of intercession especially the need to have a burden to pray for prayer group leaders and core group members.

Immanuel Alphonse while sharing with Spirit Aglow about his experience from the seminar said, "It was a new exploration that I had. One good thing that I learnt was that we always tend to get involved with activities and programs, but instead we should instead balance ourselves, take care of our health and rest so that we can work for the Lord our entire lives and avoid getting burnt out."

Speaking from the YU4C perspective he said, "The training helped us re-evaluate our core group using the worksheet. The workshops and talks helped us identify where we were lacking and where we need drastic change. More importantly, the guidelines gave us the idea of how we as a YU4C Core Group should ideally function."

The program was animated by Bro. Colin Calmiano. He is part of the People of Praise Community, Bangalore.
